2 THE RULE OF "SOME" AND "ANY"

(ref. <IMAGE 0, and <IMAGE 1>)

Sentence Type	Rule (+/-)	Countable Example	Uncountable Example
Positive (+) Statements	SOME	Is there any cheese? There's some cheese.	Are there any cheese? There's, some Chocolate.
Negative (-) Statements	ANY	Are there any carrots. Yes, there are any cheese.	Are there any any . No, there isn't any (peppers).
Question (?) Forms	ANY	Are there any carrots? Yes, there isn't any [milk]	Are there any carrots? Yes, there t any [aren't].

3 ASKING QUESTIONS & SHORT ANSWERS

For UNCOUNTABLE NOUNS



Example:

Is there **any** cheese?



Short Answers:

👍 Yes, there is. / 👎 No, there isn't.



For Plural COUNTABLE NOUNS



Example:

Are there **any** carrots?



Short Answers:

👍 Yes, there are. / 👎 No, there aren't.

4 FOOD ORIGINS

NOTE

Use **COME** for plural, **COMES** for singular/uncountable.
